#### **Program Highlights**

- Delivered 3,037 arts-in-education programs and supplemental Curriculum Connection Extension Lesson guides to improve educational outcomes and supported TEKS-embedded lessons.
- Service delivery to 297,832 EC-12 students in partnership with arts partners and teaching artists through in-person and virtual programs.
- Provided free summer arts integration programs through our Summer Bridge Program to children at Yellowstone Academy.
- Secured and distributed 142 art kits to children and families at local schools and social service centers serving youth.
- Developed TELPAS arts integration bilingual residencies and curriculum to deepen support for English Language Learners.
- Implemented an Innovation Lab and Outdoor Learning Space at Young Women's College Prep Academy that included an architect firm partnership that provided job shadowing and mentoring for the all-female STEM program of future female leaders.
- Provided free live stream TV therapeutic arts programs through ZTV in Partnership with Texas Children's Hospital.
- Designed and implemented 2 new Living Mural + Innovation Lab Outdoor Classrooms in Houston's Third Ward neighborhood.

#### **Community Building + Engagement**

- Provided shared learning opportunities to 8 summer interns through our summer learning and administrative nonprofit offices.
- Expanded access to free public programs in partnership with 24 new libraries, public parks, and community/ social service centers.
- Supported community arts events including Heartmade Art Market, Heights Kids Day of Music, Harvard ES Summer Playdates, Downtown Houston, Kempner High School International Day, Volunteer Houston NonProfit Showcase, Westbury HS, Jack Yates HS, James Driver Park, World Children's Day, and the Arts Education Partnership national conference.
- Launched the Save the Children "Wish in a Bottle" partnership project and public art installation with over 500 students from Channelview ISD.

### Capacity + Milestones

- Developed 4 new supplemental educational guides and materials to include arts integration frameworks and templates for in-school and
  after-school long-term residency programming. These materials will guide and inform the artist and educator during the implementation of our
  programs to support student development across all arts and subject areas.
- Increased rural county arts access through grant-funded programs and services, designating support to areas without access to teaching artists, performing arts venues, or dedicated fine arts educators.
- Launched the new Young Audiences of Houston's Neighborhood, Identity, and Diversity project, supporting low-resourced communities
  across Houston through grassroots local artists connecting communities, history, and culture through the arts.

#### **Professional Learning + Development**

- **Delivered professional learning sessions for 184 teaching artists**, including culturally responsive classrooms, early childhood, classroom management, arts integration, social and emotional learning, and trauma informed care.
- Trained 257 PK-5 educators through a strategic partnership with Aldine ISD, Klein ISD, and Spring ISD on effective and foundational arts integration approaches to education.
- Presented on arts integration for over 300 Houston ISD administrators and provided key support to support professional development for
  educators
- Served as expert panelists for DEIA at the YA National Conference in New Orleans.
