

Hands-On Classes | During & After School | Weekends | Summer

dance music theatre visual arts

Performances by professional artists in a large audience setting introduce students to an art form or culture through a balance of demonstration and student interaction. All performances are 45 minutes long. A back-to-back performance is two performances with no more than a 30-minute break in between.

Workshops bring professional artists into the classroom and give students hands-on experience in an artistic discipline allowing them to discover their own creative potential. Ideal for after-school, library, and community center programs, workshops can last from 45 minutes to over several hours

Residencies are a series of workshops uniquely designed to reinforce core curriculum classroom instruction, provide positive role models, enhance student self-esteem, foster relevant skills in dynamic and creative problem solving and critical thinking, and broaden a student's understanding of world art and culture. Residencies can last several weeks to an entire school year.

Professional Development by Young Audiences of Houston's professionally trained artists can hold on-site or district-wide professional development workshops that explain how to integrate arts into the core curriculum. Sessions introduce basic skills in the featured art form, arts-integration pedagogical techniques, relationships between art media and TEKS requirements, thinking skills, and learning styles. All participants of professional development workshops will receive CPE credit. TEA approved.

PROGRAM COSTS

Program Fees and Costs

Performance cost varies based on selected shows while workshops and residency pricing have a standard sliding scale based on frequency and session duration.

EC-12 Workshops and Residency Sessions - 1 Teaching Artist : 25 Participants

\$95-125 p/hr based on frequency of visits

EC-12 Arts and Culture Assembly Performances - 45m Shows for up to 400 Participants

Performances start at \$200 and audience limits vary ; prices for each show are listed in our catalog.

Professional Development - Training for EC-12th Grade Teachers

\$250 p/h ; does not include supplies. Participant limit ranges from 50-200 Teachers. PD is TEA approved and PD hours provided.

Texas Commission on the Arts (TCA) Grant Subsidy



Hands-On Classes (Before/During/After School & Community Spaces)

Workshops

Hands-on workshops bring together individual artists to encourage students to actively discover their own artistic potential. Ideal for after school, library, or community center programs. Most workshops are product based.

Arts Enrichment-Based

Arts Enrichment workshops and/or residencies focus on one or more of the various art forms: music, theatre, art, dance, digital media art, storytelling, spoken word, puppetry, creative writing, and more. Content can be customized to fit thematic themes or units.

Session Length & Participant Limit

Workshops and Residencies can range from 45–60m or longer. We require site representative to be present in the room to assist with classroom management. For most classes, there is a 25:1 student:teaching artist ratio. For EC and digital media classes, this number is smaller for participant numbers. Classes may be single or sequential.

Residencies

Residencies are multiple, participatory workshops that take place during the school day. Residencies take place in partnership with the classroom teacher and either focus on arts-integration or the artistic process.

Arts Integration-Based

Arts Integration pairs the arts with academic subjects and provides a creative lens for learning through one of the many art forms. These sessions require planning and collaboration between the Teaching Artist and classroom Teacher to align TEKS and selected academic area to art form.



LIVING MURAL PROGRAM

Project-Based Environmental Arts Residency

Living Mural Project: An Outdoor Garden Experience

This unique program combines visual arts and horticulture to create a living mural for the selected schools and their community. The program is designed to utilize the arts to provide the participants the inspiration, interest, and opportunity to connect to nature through gardening. Supply fees are an additional cost. Projects include a planning session with the artist to determine size, scope, materials, and customize project to fit your campus needs. Your entire campus can be involved in this project through separate classes and learn how to create environmental art.

SEL Programs for EC-12

Social and emotional learning (SEL) is the process that all individuals go through as they develop the intrapersonal and interpersonal skills that will help them thrive -- in their own lives, as members of their communities, and in the world at large. Children and youth need social and emotional learning skills to succeed in school and in life. Research has shown that school-wide implementations of SEL can lead to improved academic performance, decreased conflict between students, and can help students feel more invested in their school communities.

Young Audiences of Houston and SEL

SEL is encouraged both within and outside the classroom setting. However, many classroom teachers are overburdened with teaching tasks and responsibilities and could benefit from SEL themselves. YAH can help meet these needs through SEL-based programs.

Workshops & Residencies

Sessions are customized based on your needs and can be single sessions or sequential for varied age groups ranging from EC-12. Classes range from \$95-125 per hour for up to 25 participants.

Arts Integration | Troy Scheid

Arts integration is an approach to teaching and learning through which content standards are taught and assessed equitably in and through the arts. Students engage in a creative process that connects an art form and another subject area and meets evolving objectives in both. This professional development can be presented as an introduction to Arts Integration or a more in-depth approach for the seasoned staff and is for core and specials teachers in PK-12 education. Arts Integration Unlimited empowers teachers by providing tangible resources for direct implementation in the classroom. PK-12 Teachers, Limited to 50, \$250 p/h.

Music Integration | Tom Wilbeck

Participants will explore the practice of integrating music in the classroom through multidisciplinary cooperation, the use of recorded music, and the use of performed music. Topics include: Brain Development, Behavioral Science, Emotional Readiness, Multidisciplinary Cooperation, Using Recorded Music, and Using Performed Music. This PD is presented utilizing lecture, discussion, activity, implementation, and informal assessment and is tailored to either core and specials teachers. EC-5 Teachers, Limited to 75, \$250 p/h. Minimum session is 2 hours.

TEAMWORK with Tom | Tom Wilbeck

This professional development for teachers focuses on teamwork and communication and includes hands-on activities for teachers of all content areas. Tom is a Licensed Professional Counselor, trainer and performer who has been delivering therapeutic and educational intervention since 1995. He is currently in private practice as a child and adolescent therapist, licensed by the Texas State Board of Examiners and specializes in play therapy. Tom has also been a trainer for groups ranging from Exxon, Coca Cola, and NASA to early childhood education audiences in the greater Houston area. Participants will explore the developmental, behavioral, and emotional readiness of the students we serve. EC-12 Teachers, Limited to 75, \$250 p/h. Minimum session is 2 hours.

Arts Promise

Young Audiences of Houston's Arts-Promise initiative specifically supports students who struggle in traditional education settings. Often they are creative and inventive learners who need a vehicle for their own inspiration through the arts. We partner with administrators, parents, and educators to guarantee that support is broad and multifaceted, while leveraging funding not available within the community to ensure the arts are sustained to support their development.

Arts-Promise was created to specifically address the needs of at-risk youth in the Houston area by providing them with creative tools to encourage positive life choices. Through trained artists who are passionate about working with youth, teens are given a sense of hope. Studies have shown that participation in the arts deters youth from engaging in criminal activity; furthermore, teens involved in art programs are more likely to stay in school and graduate high school. The arts can be a powerful tool to engage at-risk youth, enhance creative thinking and problem solving skills, provide opportunities to make creative contributions, and be recognized in a positive way for those contributions. Additionally, the arts promote positive peer/mentor relationships by creating a working environment with clear roles and responsibilities, allowing creative expressions in a safe and supportive environment.
