PROGRAMS + SERVICES

Performances

Led by professional artists in a large audience setting introduce students to an art form or culture through a balance of demonstration and student interaction. All performances are 45 minutes long. A back-to-back performance is two performances with no more than a 30-minute break in between.

Workshops

Bring professional artists into the classroom and give students hands-on experience in an artistic discipline allowing them to discover their own creative potential. Ideal for after-school, library, and community center programs, workshops can last from 45 minutes to over several hours.

Residencies

A series of workshops uniquely designed to reinforce core curriculum classroom instruction, provide positive role models, enhance student self-esteem, foster relevant skills in dynamic and creative problem solving and critical thinking, and broaden a student's understanding of world art and culture. Residencies can last several weeks to an entire school year. Residencies can take place during or afterschool.

Professional Development

Led by Young Audiences of Houston's professionally trained artists includes onsite or district-wide professional development workshops that explain how to integrate arts into the core curriculum. Sessions introduce basic skills in the featured art form, arts-integration pedagogical techniques, relationships between art media and TEKS requirements, thinking skills, and learning styles. All participants of professional development workshops will receive CPE credit. TEA approved.

PROGRAM COSTS

Program Fees and Costs

Performance cost varies based on selected shows while workshops and residency pricing have a standard sliding scale based on frequency and session duration.

PK-12 Workshops and Residency Sessions - 1 Teaching Artist: 30 participants

\$95-125 per hour based on frequency of visits and supply costs.

PK-12 Arts and Culture Assembly Performances - 45m shows for up to 600 participants

Performances start at \$200 and audience limits vary; prices for each show are listed in our catalog.

Professional Development - Training for PK-12th Grade Teachers

\$250 per hour; does not include supplies. Participant limit ranges from 50-200 teachers. GT and CPE Credit Hours issued for all courses. TEA Approved.

Funding Programs

Financial assistance is available for schools with demonstrated needs. Schools may utilize TEA, Title, ESSER, or other funds for Young Audiences programming. All programs are TEKS-Aligned.

Hands-on workshops bring together individual artists to encourage students to actively discover their own artistic potential. Ideal for after-school, library, or community center programs. Most workshops are project-based.

Arts Enrichment

Arts Enrichment workshops and residencies focus on one or more of the various art forms: music, theatre, art, dance, digital media art, storytelling, spoken word, puppetry, creative writing, and more.

Content can be customized to fit thematic themes or TEKS.

Residencies

Residencies are multiple, participatory workshops that take place during the school day. Residencies take place in partnership with the classroom teacher and either focus on arts-integration or the artistic process. Classes are sequential.

Arts Integration

Arts Integration workshops and residency programs pair the arts with academic subjects and provide a creative lens for learning through one of the many art forms. These sessions require planning and collaboration between the Teaching Artist and classroom Teacher to align TEKS and selected academic areas to an art form.

Session Length & Participant Limit

Workshops and residencies can range from 45-60 minutes or longer. We require a site representative to be present in the room to assist with classroom management. For most classes, there is a 30:1 student to teaching artist ratio. For PK and digital media classes, this number is smaller for participant numbers. Classes may be single or sequential.
